How much is an AEIOU assessment?

All assessments are privately funded at this stage. AEIOU assessments are not eligible for Medicare or private health rebates, or NDIS funding. See other page for costs/prices.

WHICH ASSESSMENTS DO WE OFFER?

Full Autism Assessment

Location AEIOU Assessment Clinic



What:

An assessment suite and clinical report tailored to identify and capture autism symptoms and behaviours.

Report includes:

- Mullen Scales of Early Learning (MSEL) Learning and language skills (for children aged 3-5)
- Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule (ADOS-2)
- Vineland Adaptive Behaviour Scales (VABS-3) adaptive and maladaptive behaviours, daily living, socialisation, and community skills
- Gilliam Autism Rating Scales (GARS-3) autism characteristics and repetitive/restricted behaviours
- Sensory Profile (SP-2) sensory processing patterns
- Social Responsiveness Scale (SRS-2) Socialisation skills and difficulties
- Information about a child's skill set and current concerns
- Developmental history

Who:

Children aged 3 – 12 years

Cost:

\$1,300 (3-5 years) or **\$1,100** (5-12 years) (private funding only)

What:

Administration of the ADOS-2 assessment, and a detailed report. The ADOS-2 is a gold-standard semi-structured clinical assessment that identifies characteristics and behaviours related to autism in children and adults through observation and structured activities.

Who:

Children aged 2.7 – 18 years

\$600 (private funding only)
